Prayer & Spiritual Formation



For a long time, I thought prayer was a formal, beautifully worded, inspiring message to God usually offered by clergy or memorized and spoken by a lay person. I have come to realize that just as my husband and I sit on our deck discussing our concerns of the day, I can have a similar talk with God

as I voice my worries and challenges. My prayer time becomes a time of sharing, not only my concerns but my joys and praises. It can be as simple as seeing the Bradford pears in full bloom on a gorgeous, sunny day and saying “Thank you, God, for the beauty of this earth you’ve given us” or as complicated as asking for guidance in a relationship issue or seeking clarity in the hard questions that all of us have, the “Why” of it all. Then I must listen for God’s reply and guidance which often comes long after the prayer is offered, perhaps in an unexpected “A-ha!” moment. For me, this change of perception has made God a warm, loving friend whose presence I sense throughout the day rather than a distant unapproachable deity.

Building for the Future

Focus Groups have now been created to address the three major areas of need in the rebuilding and renewal process. Separate groups, made up of members and staff, will have met in late April, with the architect, to give input on the renewal of the sanctuary, the remodeling and change of the narthex, and the creation of a fellowship hall or gathering space. The individuals asked to participate in these groups were selected because of their specific interest or involvement in that portion of the building. From those focus groups, as well as the site analysis done last year, will come final recommendations and options from our architect. We expect those by mid October.

As this Phase II of the project moves forward toward completion, it is now time to address Phase III which will be the actual capital funding of any selected rebuilding or expansion. This indeed is where the serious business of Building for the Future begins. As such, it is probably time to begin some serious talk about what this all entails.

From the Site Analysis done last year, we have been told that it will cost some \$830,000 over the next five to seven years, just to keep the structure up and running and in good working order. This is not a pie-in-the-sky figure or a number that was dreamed up. It is a dollar figure that came from a highly professional architectural and engineering firm with many years of experience in working with churches, educational buildings, and commercial structures. The dollar figure reflects the fact that Epworth has not reinvested in the renewal of the structure for a long, long time. If it was broke, we fixed it. But we have not renewed or periodically updated many of the key components of this building. Many of our issues are fundamental such as electrical, plumbing, windows, roofs, floors, and more. We are indeed past the point where a cosmetic change will suffice. If Epworth is to remain Epworth, then the rebuilding of it must begin now.

As we work through the Phase II process of creating a Master Plan, we also will be starting work on the ways to fund that plan. Up until this time, the work of Building for the Future has been on paper or in discussion. We are now about to reach that time when the rubber meets the road. The future is about to arrive with all the excitement, challenge, and commitment that goes along with it.

Epworth Provides Easter Dinner for Zimbabwe Orphans/Elders

Thanks to you, many of Harare's most vulnerable, hungry people were provided with food for Easter and days following. Through your contributions to the Zimbabwe Food Ministry, food was purchased and delivered to a Harare orphanage and area where older people live. The food, already in Zimbabwe, was purchased and delivered a few days before Easter to the St. Mark's Methodist Church (Anxious' home church) in Harare and further distributed to those most in need. Our most recent order included 100 kgs each of flour, sugar, rice, and dried beans; 150 kgs mealie meal, 30 chickens, as well as various quantities of cooking oil, peanut butter, powdered milk, dried fish, bread, salt, soap, and tea. (Note: One kg = 2.2 lbs) The order totaled \$1,437.50. If you would like to contribute to this life saving ministry, please annotate your offering envelope with the words "Zimbabwe Food". Thank you again for your continued support.
